A full size porch runs around the entire perimeter of the home. An entrance from the porch into the game room, billiard room and media center is a major convenience.




Deerfield Prison for Women

Ladies from the Work Center, also known as the "Hot Lake Girls", groom and manicure the home's grounds daily from May through September.

WHATYOU MIGHT NOT KNOW ABOUT LAKE ANNA

DID YOU KNOW?

- ♦ Lake Anna is 13,000 acres and boasts more than 250 miles of shoreline.
- ♦ 9,000 acres of the lake are public and 4,000 acres are private.
- ♦ Evaluating trends in state fishing license sales around the lake reveals that approximately fifty percent of all fishing license sales are to out-of-state anglers.
- ♦ In 1971 the lake was created for the purpose of providing cooling waters for the North Anna Power Plant.
- ♦ The lake was expected to take three years to fill, to the full pond, but heavy rains (14") from Hurricane Agnes in 1972 filled the lake two years ahead of schedule.
- ♦ There are 40 species of fish inhabiting Lake Anna.



- ♦ The largemouth bass record for Lake Anna is 13 pounds even and was set in 1986
- ♦ The Average high temperature for May is 77.7 Fahrenheit.
- ♦ In 2006 biologists electro-fishing Lake Anna recorded catch rates of 29 largemouth bass per hour at 15 inches in length.
- ◆ Some anglers refer to Lake Anna as "The Dead Sea".

DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO LAKE ANNA INTERSTATE NINETY-FIVE

Directions to Lake Anna from I-95

Lake Anna is located 18 miles west of I-95, approximately midway between Washington D.C. and Richmond VA. Following are directions to Lake Anna's "midpoint" the Route 208 bridge.

Take exit 118 Thornburg (Route 606) off Interstate 95. Turn onto Route 606 West. Proceed approximately 5 miles to the stoplight at Snell. Continue straight through the light on Routes 208 west and 606 west. Continue about 4 more miles following 208 west signs. Make a

90 degree left hand turn at Post Oak, staying on 208 west... (Route 606 goes straight at this point...) Continue on 208 West for approximately 11 miles to the 208 bridge.



The Story of Bass Fishing On The Hot Side

When fishing the hot side of Anna, I like to target the main lake points and rocky dropoffs. A dropoff into 15+ feet of water with rocks and stumps will hold lots of fish. Patience will be needed to catch them.

In Pond One, I like to fish the point opposite the warm water discharge with ¼ oz. Rat-L-Traps. There are normally lots of fish here, feeding on baitfish. https://www.google.com/maps/@38.0599284,-77.7871271,281m/data=!3m1!1e3 (or) https://www.google.com/maps/@38.0506949,-77.7830961,505m/data=!3m1!1e3

After fishing this point, I head for the left end of the riprap on Dyke One. I fish this with a large slow-rolled spinnerbait and a Rattling Rogue jerkbait, fished parallel to the riprap. https://www.google.com/maps/@38.0496917,-77.7779804,1029m/data=!3m1!1e3

I will then head for the Canal and fish the left side with small plastic worms and drop shot rigs. When I get to the bridge, I like to toss a Hopkins ¾ oz. Shorty Spoon to the base of the pilings. I pick up the spoon and if no weight is felt, let it fall again. I repeat this until I have either caught all the fish or determine there are no fish there. https://www.google.com/maps/ @38.0407275,-77.7763403,676 m/data=!3m1!1e3

Leaving the canal, I head to the right and under the bridge into Elk Creek. I fish the points on the both sides, paying particular attention to rocky points.

After fishing Elk Creek (Beaver Creek), I head back out and around to the right between Barkleys and Busbees Islands and into Millpond Creek. https://www.google.com/maps/@38.0235454,-77.7668135,1292m/data=!3m1!1e3

I generally stop at the first cove on the right before the bridge. This cove is the reason for the creek name. https:// www.google.com/maps/ @38.023436,-77.7740366,830m/ data=!3m1!1e3 It contains a millpond that was inundated when the lake was filled. The dam goes across the cove about 2/3 back. It comes up to about 6 feet and then plunges to 25+ feet on the outside and 15+ feet on the inside. This dam, combined with the riprap of the bridge, is good bass habitat. Bottom fishing plastics is the best method. https:// www.google.com/maps/ @38.0227386,-77.7743306,315 m/data=!3m1!1e3

Going under the bridge, I like to fish the points on the left side https://www.google.com/maps/@38.0133384,-77.7794023,1387m/data=!3m1!1e3 with Rat-L-Traps, spinnerbaits and jerk baits all the way back to the first cove beyond the last boat dock. https://www.google.com/maps/@38.0085287,-77.7895271,1099m/data=!3m1!1e3

Next, I head for the canal to Pond Three. https://www.google.com/maps/ @37.9911324,-@38.0080901,-77.7502753,4979 m/data=!3m1!1e3

This canal makes a dogleg to the left and the riprap drops into 20+ feet of water. https://www.google.com/maps/@37.9989253,-77.7635273,2369m/data=!3m1!1e3 I like to fish a Carolina rig, Shaky Head or split shot rig at the outside bend of this dogleg. Lots of fish here. https://www.google.com/maps/@37.9990308,-77.7642381,398m/data=!3m1!1e3

Continuing, I like to fish the right side at the bridge pilings https://www.google.com/maps/
@37.9971407,-77.7640345,131 m/data=!3m1!1e3 and down to the next inlet with docks. https://www.google.com/maps/
@37.9929109,-77.7647177,370 m/data=!3m1!1e3 This point drops into 13 feet and has lots of rocks on it. Fish this, as well as the inlet with the docks.

Coming out of the creek, I turn left and head for Rock Creek. You will recognize it by the gazebo on a point. https:// www.google.com/maps/ @37.9921177,-77.7558083,129 m/data=!3m1!1e3 Head for the left bank directly opposite the gazebo. This bank drops into 25+ feet of water and is loaded with stumps all the way down. I like casting drop shot rigs and Shaky Heads up in the shallows on this bank and fishing them all the way down to 27 feet. Most of my fish come from 20+ feet of water.

Heading into Rock Creek, you will see a number of downed trees in the water on the right side. https://www.google.com/maps/ @37.9911324,-77.752888,140m/data=!3m1!1e3

Saturday May 7, 2016

First day weigh-in is at 6:00pm sharp with dinner at midnight - God willing. A menu of oyster casserole accompanied by braised greens turnips and apples. For dessert it's Chef Olly's famous Virginia baked Shoefly pie.

Monday, May 9, 2016

Day 2, Maestro Grogan offers members, once again, a breakfastin-bed choice of hot chicken and waffles or a fig and walnut salad. Blastoff on Monday is at 05:00am.
